Takeaways from the panel

- Launching follow-up work on developing an international micro data standard; investigate what is feasible
 - Proposal to G20 DGI Global Conference
- Invite International Organisations and G20 economies to participate in the work. Data standard in the form of a self-commitment by countries – to be investigated
- Cooperation with INEXDA and other groups to identify, share and document good practices (e.g. access for research, private<>public cooperation, open data, non-statistical examples)
- Use of new architecture, tools and staff skills to facilitate the sharing of confidential data (different models ... e.g. privacy-preserving techniques and new encryption techniques) and promote efficiency
- Addressing national (and international?) legal issues on the exchange of confidential information
- Cooperation with major data holders (IT G20 Presidency data access)
- Work needs to cover <u>principles</u>, <u>enablers</u>, <u>users</u> elaborate the <u>benefits of</u> <u>data sharing</u> (to users, to respondents); privacy and cybersecurity assured
