# **Work Plan Implementation Has Been Strong**


# FY24 HIGHLIGHTS (12 months into the work plan – May 2023 to April 2024):

- CD\* activities: 117 –an acceleration compared to FY23 (81) with return medium-term objectives; mix of remote, in-person and blended CD delivery.
- Total spending: \$7.1m —an increase compared to FY23 (\$6.0m).
- Ad hoc advisory services: 38 –downward trend (55 in FY23), mainly on fiscal and debt statistics, as in previous years.
- Online courses: 27 offerings in FY24, including 2 new courses (FSIx and PPIx) –benefiting about 4,500 learners in 3 languages, a record so far in terms of offerings and yearly reach.






# Mobile money data reporters 100 80 40 20

## **FAS Advisory Group**

- Established in October 2023.
- Inaugural meeting in November 2023.
   (Virtual)
- Second meeting in April 2024. (In person in Washington DC)
- Actionable recommendations to be reflected in the future FAS work program:
  - Maximize complementarity between FAS and other financial inclusion databases.
  - Use partner institutions networks to promote FAS.
  - Identify trainings on financial inclusion provided by partners and coordinate FAS trainings with them.
  - Assess differences between supply and demand side databases to understand progress and barriers to financial access.



# Statistical Information Management (SIM) Focus on SDMX to support Data Standards


 Objective of this small module is to advance innovative ways to integrate technological advances into statistics compilation and dissemination, with a focus on the Statistical Data and Metadata Exchange (SDMX), in line with recommendations in the IMF's 10th Review of the Data Standards Initiatives.

 Enhancing statistical information management is a more medium-term reform objective that also requires IT investments.

Focus in FY24 remained Africa, in collaboration with the African Development Bank.



# Strategic Log Frame - Ratings Are Moving Toward The Green Zone



#### **Progress towards outcomes varies across work streams**

 Achieving results in some statistical areas takes longer than in others, but most outcomes are expected to be largely or fully achieved by the end of Phase I.

#### Outcomes have already been fully or largely achieved for online learning, FAS and GFS

- but more can and will still be achieved under Phase I.

#### Progress has been mixed on other work streams

- but all work streams outcome indicators are moving towards the green zone.
