
- 1. This status report reviews progress toward implementation of the 2010 Quota and Governance Reforms. It updates the status of consents to the proposed quota increases under the 14th General Review of Quotas and of acceptances of the Proposed Seventh Amendment on the Reform of the Executive Board ("Board Reform Amendment" or "Seventh Amendment") as set out in the Board of Governors Resolution No. 66-2.
- 2. For the proposed quota increases under the 14th General Review of Quotas to become effective, members having not less than 70 percent of the total of quotas on November 5, 2010 must consent to the increases in their quotas and the proposed Board Reform Amendment must have entered into force.¹ The proposed Board Reform Amendment enters into force once the Fund certifies that three-fifths of the members (i.e., currently 113 members) representing 85 percent of the total voting power have accepted the proposed amendment.
- 3. As of July 17, 2013, 151 members having 78.4 percent of quotas as of November 5, 2010 had consented to their proposed quota increases under the 14th General Review of Quotas. As of the same date, 140 members having 75.7 percent of the total voting power had accepted the proposed Board Reform Amendment (see attached Tables).
- 4. The previous status report was issued to the Executive Board on June 14, 2013.² Since then, one more member has accepted the proposed Board Reform Amendment. Overall, the membership has achieved the quota threshold for effectiveness of the quota increases under the 14th General Review of Quotas and one of the thresholds, namely the required number of members, for the entry into force of the Board Reform Amendment. However, the membership is about nine-tenths of the way toward meeting the second threshold, namely the voting power threshold, for the entry into force of the Board Reform Amendment, which

is also necessary for the effectiveness of the quota increase. It remains critically important to reach the required voting power threshold as soon as possible.

5. Staff and management continue to work closely with country authorities to secure additional acceptances and consents in collaboration with Executive Directors. The staff will report to the Executive Board on the status of acceptances when there is important progress.³
