

Maputo headline inflation – April 2011

Main facts:

- The Maputo headline CPI continued to hover around zero (this time 0.4 percent) in April, being consistent with historical patterns. This result has brought 12-month end of period down to 13 percent (against 14.7 percent in March) whilst average continued to rise steadily (15.4 now from 15.1 percent last month).
- Although prices of some food items (e.g. fresh fish, onions, sugar and lettuce), fuel products (charcoal as well as liquid fuels, whose prices were adjusted upwards at end-April), the total inflation rate was contained by the falling prices of a few food staples (tomatoes and coconuts) and new and second-hand vehicles (which have seen their prices going down likely due to exchange rate appreciation).
- Core inflation¹ also maintained the downtrend that began in March (10.2 against previous 11.1 percent).



¹ This core inflation measures excludes food, energy and fuels consumption from the total inflation.
