

## **Maputo headline inflation – November 2011**

## Main facts:

- Monthly inflation rate in Maputo was 0.5 percent last month, the second lowest November rate over the last ten years. This result brought the end of period down to 7.7 percent (from 8.3), thus making possible the end-year target (8.4 percent) to be met. The average also came down to 11.3 percent (from 11.9).
- Food items dominated by 92 percent current contributions to total price increases, with tomatoes and fisheries being the frontrunners.
- This time core inflation<sup>1</sup> reversed the previous downward trend. It increased to 6.9 percent from prior 6.8 percent.



 $<sup>^{\</sup>mathrm{1}}$  This core inflation measures excludes food, energy and fuels consumption from the total inflation.
