

Maputo headline inflation – April 2012

Main facts:

- The inflation rate in April remained again near zero (-0.1 percent), repeating a seasonal
 pattern of stability that is well-known at this time of the year. This result brings the end of
 period and average further down to 2.5 and 6.4 percent, respectively. The accumulated
 inflation through April reached 0.6 percent, against 3.4 percent recorded in the same period
 last year.
- Food items continued to steer global inflation to the downside, although non-food inflation also turns out to be an important explanatory factor.
- Core inflation¹ further slipped to 2.1 percent, coming from previous 2.3 percent.



¹ This core inflation measures excludes food, energy and fuels consumption from the total inflation.
