1. Background

Policy needs

- Multipurpose statistics, adaptable to new needs
- Globally consistent and shared

General objectives

- Reduce reporting burden on NSIs
- More efficient use of resources in International Organisations
- Ensure high quality and consistency
- Improve global data dissemination

SDMX

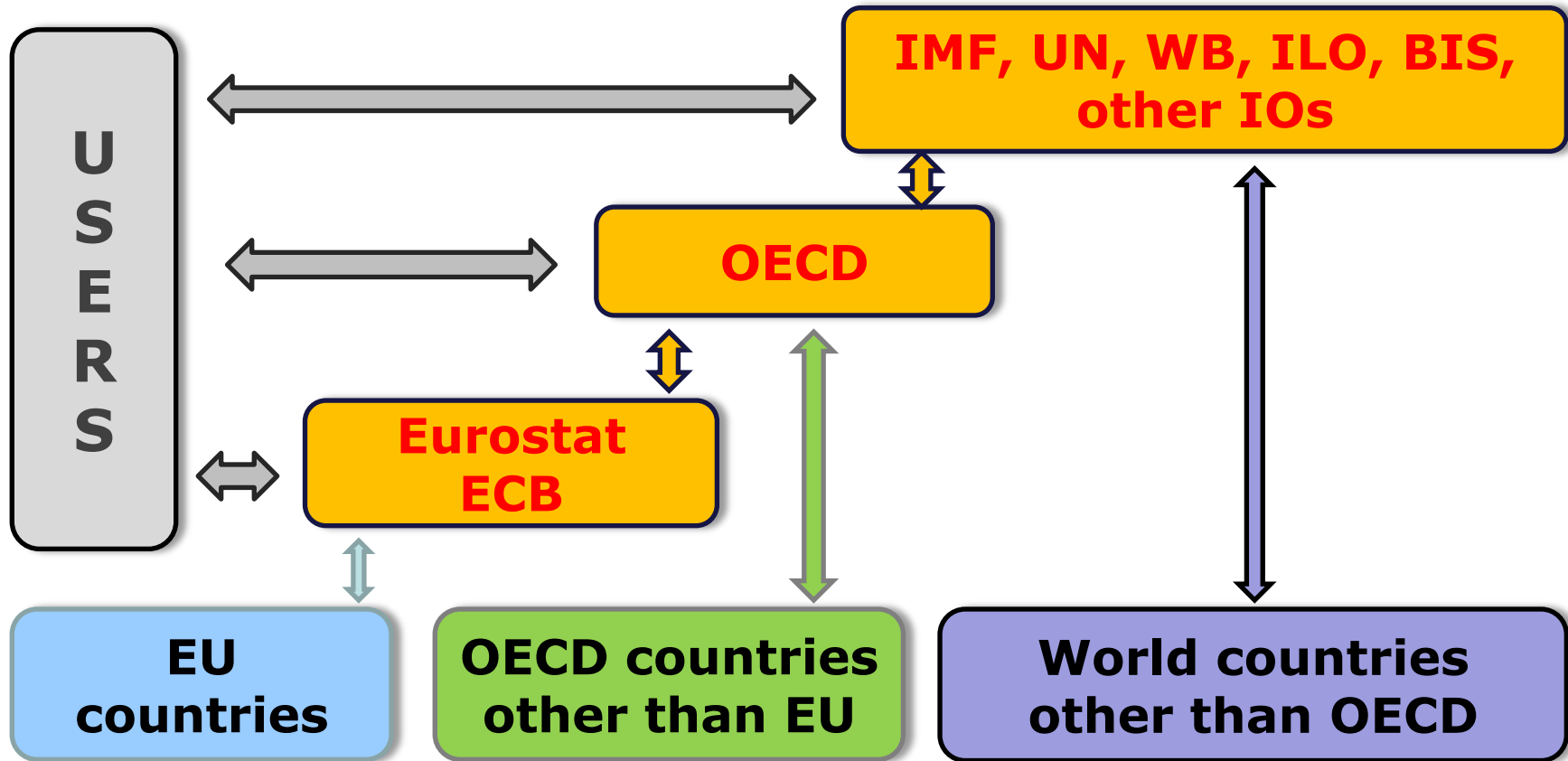
- New technical possibilities
- Clear rules and responsibilities

- 1. Common statistical concepts and definitions**
- 2. Globally harmonised reporting templates**
- 3. Global data cooperation (focus on published data)**
- 4. Single point for data quality management**
- 5. Coordinated data flow**

4. Infrastructure

- **Agreed statistical standards**
 - SNA 2008, ESA 2010, BPM6, manuals
- **Aligned templates**
 - NA main aggregates / sector accounts / BoP
- **Harmonised protocols**
 - SDMX / Data Structure Definitions
- **Streamlined processes**
 - Frequency and timeliness
 - Data quality management

5. The way forward: Pilot projects

- **IAG Task Force: TEST**
 - - data cooperation guidelines
 - - practical arrangements
- **Scope**
 - 1 - Detailed sector accounts
 - 2 - GDP main aggregates, population
- **Report to IAG 09/2013**
 - Templates
 - Co-ordinated and consistent workflow
 - IT technical readiness of participants
 - Timetable for execution



6. Eurostat-OECD Protocol for NA data

Stocktaking

Stocktaking of practices, problems and expectations

Peer review validation

Peer review of current validation routines; identification of gaps and minimum checks prior dissemination

Workflow

Exploring exchange of non-validated data (timeliness) and restricted data (embargo/ not for publication/ confidential)

Protocol

OECD-Eurostat Protocol signed by Directors General (Martine Durand and Walter Radermacher) on 12 June 2013

Implementation

Implement and test agreed improved validation and data cooperation procedures
