



Neil Saker is the IMF's mission chief for Timor-Leste. He has been at the IMF for over 12 years. In addition to working in the Asia and Pacific Department, he has worked in the IMF's Monetary and Capital Markets Department on a wide range of financial sector issues and the IMF-STI in Singapore where helped trained Asian officials in macroeconomic and financial sector issues.
