



Dr. Yoshitaka Hosoi is currently Visiting professor of Akita University and Senior Advisor for Natural Resources, Japan International Corporation Agency.

Before JICA, he has worked for Deep Ocean Resources Development Co., Ltd. (DORD), which holds manganese nodules concession in central Pacific, as general manager of exploration department for planning and executing exploration for sea-floor hydrothermal deposit and cobalt-rich crust, and administrating scientists. He has also joined technical session of International Seabed Authority (ISA).

Before DORD, he has worked for Japan Oil, Gas and Metals National Corporation (JOGMEC), which is Japanese Governmental Organization for 33 years. Dr. Hosoi has qualifications both in mining and in economics, and holds a Bachelor of Engineering from Akita University and a Doctor of Philosophy in Economics from The University of Queensland.

As well as a visiting professor at the Akita University in Japan, he has been a visiting lecturer at the University of Tokyo, Hokkaido University, Osaka University, the University of South Pacific in Fiji and Adamson University in the Philippines, Dr. Hosoi has held positions in SODIMIZA mining company in Zaire, MMAJ (Metal Mining Agency of Japan), JMEC (Japan Mining Engineering Centre for International Cooperation), and SOPAC (South Pacific Applied Geosciences Commission) in Fiji.

He has also published numerous papers and articles in areas of exploration, the mining industry and economics. He published books “Mining and Development” in 2009 and “Mineral Resources Frontier (Japanese)” in 2012.
