## Summary Results of Eurostat Ad-Hoc Survey On Remittances





#### Introduction

- In recent years there has been increasing demand for statistics on remittances.
- The availability of data at EU level is, however, rather limited.
- Eurostat does not currently disseminate data on remittances – either at Member State level or as aggregated data for the EU.
- BOP Working Group agreed, in its March 2007 meeting, to launch an ad-hoc survey in order to collect more data on remittances.





## Ad-hoc survey on remittances

Eurostat launched an ad-hoc survey asking MS to transmit annual credits and debits data on:

- Workers' remittances
- Compensation of employees
- "Net compensation of employees"

#### vis-à-vis:

- Intra-EU27 / Extra-EU27 / Total World
- 3 major destinations, and
- 3 major source countries

for the years 2005 and 2006.





## Ad-hoc survey on remittances

- This would allow Eurostat to calculate EU aggregates vis-à-vis rest-of-the world.
- It would also allow identifying and quantifying the most important corridors of remittances' flows.
- Moreover, Eurostat would be able to calculate EU aggregates according to:
  - current definition of workers' remittances, and
  - proposed definition personal remittances to be included in BMP6.



## Ad-hoc survey on remittances

- All 27 Member States participated in this survey (there were a few missing values)
- In order to calculate the EU aggregates, Eurostat estimated the missing values using various other data sources
- The data provided by the Member States take account of flows officially recorded within the framework of balance of payments statistics.
- Money sent through informal or illegal channels are not usually recorded and therefore not part of the statistics presented in this document.


