

Charles McPherson consults internationally on petroleum and minerals policies. He was Technical Assistance Adviser in the International Monetary Fund's Fiscal Affairs Department from 2007 to 2010, with particular responsibilities for fiscal and financial policies in natural resource rich countries. Prior to taking up his position at the Fund, he was Senior Adviser on Oil and Gas at the World Bank. His work at the Bank focused on petroleum sector reform and sector lending activities in Angola, Argentina, Nigeria, the Russian Federation, and elsewhere. He also managed the Bank's participation in the Extractive Industries Transparency Initiative (EITI). Before joining the Bank, Mr. McPherson spent 15 years at two international oil companies, holding a variety of senior positions in international negotiations and government agreements. He received his B.A. in economics and political science from McGill University, M.Sc. in international economics from the London School of Economics and Political Science, and Ph.D. in economics from the University of Chicago. He is a Canadian and British citizen. Mr. McPherson currently consults for both the IMF and World Bank and is on the Global Faculty of the Centre for Energy, Petroleum and Mineral Law and Policy at the University of Dundee in Scotland.
