ALI MANSOOR



Ali Mansoor, is currently an Assistant Director at the IMF and Division Chief for the West Africa 1 Division of the African Department. Previously he was the Financial Secretary in Mauritius from 2006 to 2013, where he formulated and implemented a wide-ranging reform program. He also served as Chair of the Global Forum for Migration and Development (GFMD) in 2012 and was CEO of the COMESA Clearing House (1997-99). Prior to his return to Mauritius, he had worked in the Office of the Chief Economist for the Europe and Central Asia Region in the World Bank (2003-06), in the Independent Evaluation Office of the IMF (2001-03) and as a senior economist in FAD

(1999-2001). He also spent three years at the EU Directorate for Development from 1992 to 1995. He has written on regional integration, privatization, migration, fiscal decentralization, and Capacity Development.

Dr. Sebastian James works for the World Bank group and is a Tax Specialist. Apart from the Taxation, he has worked in cross-cutting areas on Investment Policy and Special Economic Zones. He has advised over 30 countries on the design of their tax policy and tax administration with emphasis on improving their investment climate. He is the primary author of a Handbook of Tax Simplification and his research on Tax Incentives has been published widely. He is a former Indian Revenue Service officer and held senior positions in the India's Tax Administration and Tax Policy between 1996 and 2002. and subsequently completed his Masters in Public Administration in 2004 and PhD from Harvard University in 2007 with his research focusing on Tax Policy and Tax Administration in developing countries.
