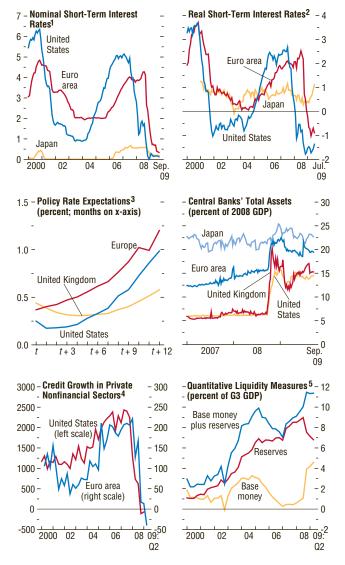
Figure 1.6. Measures of Monetary Policy and Liquidity in Selected Advanced Economies
